**Early-Career Philosophers**

The Covid-19 pandemic has wreaked havoc on conferences, travel budgets, and opportunities to present new research. Due to the pandemic, the North American Fichte Society has already postponed its 2021 conference to 2022. While senior philosophers may have projects already up and running to keep them occupied, many early-career philosophers depend on workshops and conferences to further their research. The North American Fichte Society is offering this opportunity for early-career philosophers to workshop papers in an online format with the hope that this will support their own projects as well as scholarship on Fichte more generally.

By “early-career” we mean graduate students, post-docs, or anyone whose Ph.D. was granted in 2015 or after.

We are issuing an open call for papers on any topic on Fichte. Papers may address any of his works, themes in his work, or his work in relationship to other philosophers or movements. We ask that abstracts of 750 words and a CV are sent to Gabriel Gottlieb ([gottliebg@xavier.edu](mailto:gottliebg@xavier.edu)) by March 10 for papers to be presented in April or May. Presentations will take place on Zoom and papers should have a maximum reading time of 30 minutes (which will leave 30 minutes for discussion).
